### The Paris Airports cross the symbolic threshold of 100 million passengers in a year

This year, Paris Aéroport has broken its annual **traffic record** having, for the first time in its history, reached the level of **100 million passengers**<sup>1</sup>.

This figure is the reward for the hard work that Paris Aéroport - including Paris-Orly and Paris-Charles de Gaulle airports - has done to attract more air traffic year-on-year and develop the Paris airports' connectivity. In ten years, the number of passengers travelling through Paris has risen by 13.6 million and the capacities at both Paris-Charles de Gaulle and Paris-Orly airports have considerably increased to support the airlines' development. Along with this growth, a special attention is given to the impact on neighbouring communities within the frame of noise control regulations (the capping of airline movements at Paris-Orly Airport and the monitoring of noise levels at Paris-Charles de Gaulle Airport).

**Augustin de Romanet, Chairman & Chief Executive Officer of Groupe ADP**, stated:

*"We are proud and happy to celebrate this historic record with our passengers. This symbolic figure is an illustration of how vital and attractive the Paris airports are, and it was reached thanks to the day-to-day efforts and know-how of Groupe ADP employees and of the entire airport community."*

*"The collective aim of the people that make this airport is to offer passengers a memorable experience and to encourage them to travel. Our airports are not just transit areas, they are genuine living facilities conducive to working, learning, discovering, having fun and being charmed."*

To celebrate the threshold of 100 million passengers in 2017, **Paris Airports' staff rallied** to say "**MERCI**" ("Thank you") to our customers.

On Thursday 21 December, from 6:00 to 9:30 am, passengers landing at Terminal 2E (Baggage reclaim area) at Paris-Charles de Gaulle Airport or from 7:30 to 11:00 am in the West Terminal at Paris-Orly Airport will be greeted by music, offered breakfast and given a present that reflects the holiday spirit.
