Aéroports de Paris opens a new industrial maintenance facility at Paris-Charles de Gaulle Airport

As landowner, developer and 100% investor in the project, Aéroports de Paris is today inaugurating a new building at Paris-Charles de Gaulle Airport dedicated to the maintenance of ground support equipment. This new 5,700 sqm maintenance facility comprises 4,300 sqm of workshops and 1,400 sqm of office space.

Built on a 1.7 hectare plot, this property programme, the first phase of which was completed in January 2016, enables the creation of an equipment maintenance facility bringing together the Ground Support Equipment (GSE) services required for airside airport operations. The ground support equipment concerned includes, for example, pushback tractors and mobile stairs.

Located in the heart of the Paris-Charles de Gaulle Airport with direct access to the taxiways and aircraft aprons, the first phase of this programme (4,300 sqm of workshops) is dedicated to two continent-wide operators: TCR and AEROLIMA (the company recently created by the merger of Euroman and Manustra). An extension to the programme, concerning approximately 1,300 sqm, is scheduled for delivery in 2017, on behalf of TCR.

Christophe GUIR, Chairman and CEO of AEROLIMA Group stated:

"The strong growth in our activities at the airport made it necessary to bring together, in a single 2,400 sqm building, some of our maintenance workshops and a workshop for bodywork and sheet metalwork including a paint booth with the capacity to accommodate the largest airport machinery, in addition to the group's general management in a 500 sqm platform of office space.

Thanks to our excellent cooperation with Aéroports de Paris, we have been able to construct this building which fully meets our requirements and at the same time maintain considerable independence in developing the areas and installing our maintenance equipment. We can thus make the full range of runway equipment services available to all customers of the airport through direct private access in the restricted area while at the same time benefiting from the freedom allowed us by locating the workshops in the public area. Finally, we have established our engineering and equipment refurbishing subsidiary (3,500 sqm) at the Mitry site. This allows us to devote all our resources at Roissy to runway equipment maintenance."





Brice HADJOGLOU, CEO of TCR added:

"These long-awaited new facilities are part of the development process undertaken by our group. Some of our technicians at Paris-Charles de Gaulle Airport have been working in this new workshop since mid-February 2016. The other teams will follow as soon as Aéroports de Paris has delivered the second phase. TCR thus has a new industrial tool bringing a fresh dynamic and the capacity to respond more closely to the current needs of our customers. With the extension to the building planned for 2017 and increasing the facility to 2,700 sqm, TCR France will bring its activities together in a single site and thus optimise its production."

"By creating this Equipment Maintenance Centre, Aéroports de Paris has confirmed its determination to step up its role as a property investor and to ensure that the needs of its customers are best met, by enabling them to improve their operational processes. This fosters value creation for all the airport's economic stakeholders. The commissioning of this new asset is an essential first stage in the strategy of invigorating industrial maintenance activities that are vital to the running of airport operations."
