A photography exhibition by Jonathan Paciullo

From 18 February to 19 March 2016

On the occasion of Paris Fashion Week, Aéroports de Paris will be celebrating the fashion sense of its passengers with an exhibition to be shown at Paris-Charles de Gaulle Airport and on the walls of the Paris City Hall.

The airport is the quintessential meeting place that sees every imaginable culture and style pass through its terminals. In celebration of Paris Fashion Week, which will take place from 1 to 9 March, Aéroports de Paris wanted to showcase the beauty and diversity of his passengers.

Over the course of three months, photographer Jonathan Paciullo focused his lens on the thousands of passengers who visit the airport each day. Hipsters, fashionistas, and men and women in traditional dress are just some examples of the styles featured. This exhibition includes large-scale photographs of twenty-seven subjects (84, 4 x 3 m canvases) that can be viewed in Paris-Charles de Gaulle Airport's nine terminals from 18 February to 19 March.

Fashion loves Paris

In partnership with Paris City Hall, the photographs taken at Paris-Charles de Gaulle will also be displayed on Rivoli street for three weeks starting on 1 March.

A film entitled "Fashion Loves Paris" highlighting Paris' expertise in fashion and handicrafts will also be shown on screens in the baggage reclaim area, immersing passengers in the world of Fashion Week as soon as they step foot in the airport.

Paris airports are the first point of contact between visitors and the city, especially during "Fashion Week". They are also a focal point of culture and a crossroads frequented by cultures from the world over. Moreover, the biggest names in fashion are represented in the airports, which today constitute one of Paris' largest department stores. Through this initiative, Aéroports de Paris is seeking to strengthen its ties to the world of fashion by paying tribute to the style of its passengers.
