## Aéroports de Paris July 2009 traffic figures

### Passenger traffic

In July 2009, passenger traffic at Aéroports de Paris dropped by 3.1% compared to July 2008. Paris airports handled a total of 8.2 million passengers divided up between 5.7 million for Paris-Charles de Gaulle (-4.3%) and 2.5 million for Paris-Orly (-0.2%).

- In July, international traffic (excluding Europe) decreased by 2.4%. Traffic on routes to and from Africa was buoyant with a 3.3% increase. Traffic on North America routes fell by 4.6% while Latin America dropped by 7.6%. On Middle Eastern and Asian routes, traffic dropped by 5.0% and 5.7% respectively.
- European traffic (excluding France) fell by 3.6% including -3.5% on Schengen routes and -5.9% for the British and Irish markets.
- Domestic traffic stood at -4.8%.
- The number of connecting passengers decreased by 2.8% in July 2009 compared with July 2008 with a connecting rate of 22.2% (a stable connecting rate compared with July 2008).

For the first seven months of the year, passenger traffic decreased by 5.9%. For the same period, the number of connecting passengers decreased by 4.6% resulting in a connecting rate of 24.0% (against 23.7% for the first seven months of 2008).

### Aircraft movements

The number of aircraft movements saw a 5.7% decrease in July 2009 year on year (-7.2% at Paris-Charles de Gaulle and -2.4% at Paris-Orly). The passenger load factor reached 79.7% compared with 78.1% in July 2008.
