Summer 2015 The Paris airports hit new daily traffic record

On Sunday, 26 July 2015, **over 231,500 passengers** came through Paris-Charles de Gaulle Airport in a single day, thereby breaking the previous record set on 17 August 2014 when Paris-Orly Airport was host to over **228,800 passengers**.

Furthermore, Paris-Charles de Gaulle handled over 230,000 passengers daily on three occasions during July 2015.

Paris-Orly airport handled **over 102,000 passengers daily** on three occasions during July, peaking at over 103,700 passengers on 31 July 2015.

Now that many holidaymakers are returning, Aéroports de Paris teams remain ready, now more than ever, to receive passengers in the best possible conditions at Paris-Charles de Gaulle and Paris-Orly Airports.

Nearly 300 information officers and "orange vests" will be assisting the teams already in place to help direct and advise travellers in the airports. Over 1,000 Airport Helpers will also be deployed to help, guide, and inform passengers and those accompanying them to the airport. These volunteers will also continue to perform their regular daily duties. They can be identified by their "Happy to Help You" badges.
